## Manchester Art Gallery

Manchester Art Gallery is renowned for its collection of work by British 19th C. artists, particularly the Pre-Raphaelites but also has a fine display of works by Thomas Gainsborough, Joshua Reynolds and George Stubbs. The European Old Masters collection includes Dutch and Flemish artists and holds over 2,000 oil paintings, plus related studies and archival material, and the gallery has a renewed focus on collecting contemporary art.

## Salford Quays & Media City

Transformed from a historic industrial port on the banks of the Manchester Ship Canal, today Salford Quays is a modern, vibrant destination for culture, media, and leisure. Innovative architecture defines the waterfront including the hub for technology, creativity and innovation, Media City, home to broadcasters and studios, as well as a variety of dining and shopping.

## Imperial War Museum North

The IWM North tells powerful stories of war from the First World War to the present day. The galleries and exhibitions offer fascinating perspectives, and demonstrate the impact of conflict on modern people and society.

## Manchester Museum of Science & Industry

Journey through Manchester's history, its remarkable role in the Industrial Revolution and the social history of the factory workers and complex history of the textile industry. Located on the site of the world's oldest surviving passenger railway station, the architecture of this 1830's building is fascinating and visitors can still see original railway tracks in situ.

## People's History Museum

Dedicated to the history of the working class and the development of democracy in Britain, the People's History Museum tells stories of the many ordinary people who fought for rights, social justice and political representation over the last 200 years. It is also home to the world's largest collection of trade union and political banners which are not only historic but also visually stunning and are a key attraction for those visiting the museum.

## John Ryland's Library

This stunning library in the heart of the city is part of the University of Manchester. An extraordinary neo-Gothic building, it houses one of the world's most unique collections of books, manuscripts, maps, and more. It is also home to a papyrus fragment of the Gospel of St John - the earliest part of any New Testament writing in existence.

## Victoria Baths

First opened in 1906, this Edwardian complex of swimming pools and Turkish baths has an interesting history. When the baths opened they were state-of-the-art and described as a 'water palace'. After a closure in the 1990s, the heritage baths have been partially restored, with further conservation work in the pipeline for the future.

## Manchester Ship Canal Boat Trip

A boat trip from Manchester city centre to Salford Quays offers a unique perspective on the city's industrial past and modern regeneration. Taking in both the historic River Irwell and the Manchester Ship Canal, the journey takes in a blend of architectural styles and famous landmarks, from Stephenson's 1830 Bridge to Old Trafford Football Stadium.
